1.0 **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 The following is AAI Security Systems' Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement as required under s54, Part 6, of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 ("the Act"). This Statement and Policy is made voluntarily as a small business and is not a legislative requirement of the Act.
- 1.2 However, under BS 25700:2022 (Organizational responses to modern slavery guidance), it states that all Companies have a responsibility to understand modern slavery risks to their business and whether they can be implicated as a result of their activities, products and services, and business relationships.

2.0 **SCOPE**

2.1 AAI Security Systems is a business service provider specialising in the provision of the design, installation and maintenance of intruder alarm systems, fire alarm and smoke detection systems, CCTV systems and access control systems. The Company also supplies, commissions and maintains portable fire extinguishers. The Company is based in Borehamwood, Hertfordshire.

3.0 MODERN SLAVERY

- 3.1 Modern Slavery is difficult to define. Modern Slavery practices sit at the extreme end of a continuum of exploitation, ranging from "decent work" to severe forms of labour exploitation, involving poor working and living conditions which harm human dignity. It is a criminal offence and a serious violation of people's fundamental human and labour rights. There is a right not to be held in practices such as slavery, servitude and forced labour, which is echoed in core international frameworks.
- 3.2 Modern forms of slavery can include debt bondage (where a person is forced to work for free to pay off a debt), child slavery, forced marriage, domestic servitude, forced labour, where victims are made to work through violence and intimidation, and sex trafficking.

4.0 **OUR BUSINESS**

4.1 AAI Security Systems employs around 30 people and has one base, located in Borehamwood, Herts. See Appendix 1 for Organisation Structure. Further details are located within the Quality Management System Policy Manual (Quality Manual for Fire Security).

4.0 **SUPPLY CHAIN**

4.1 Our supply chains include sourcing materials and hardware from various wholesale and other suppliers principally located within the United Kingdom to enable the supply and/or installation of security systems for our Customers.

 - We will ensure that our employees are knowledgeable in understanding health and safety measures required to prevent the spread of coronavirus, including social distance measures.
 - We will make this Statement available on request. It will also be publicly available on our website so it can be accessed at any time.
